PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The County Administrator introduced Jason Varno:

Jason was born and raised in Auburn, NY. Following graduation, Jason began classes at SUNY Geneseo pursuing a bachelor's degree in Geography. In 1989 he attended boot camp at Cape May, New Jersey. For graduating top of his class he was awarded with the Honor Graduate Medal. Jason attended Advanced Training as a Port Securityman in Yorktown, Virginia. In April of 1991, he enlisted in the US Coast Guard Reserve and was assigned to the US Coast Guard Reserve Small Boat Station in Rochester & Port Security Unit 301. Unit 301 Maritime Security Team was utilized as a quick reaction force deployable within hours. This unit was comprised of a hybrid class of corrections officers, firemen, and policemen. Jason's unit deployed to Haiti in 1994 as part of Operation Uphold Democracy.

Jason attended SUNY Geneseo while serving in the US Coast Guard Reserve. From 1991 to 1993 he worked in the SUNY Geneseo Public Safety Department Director of the Student Public Safety Aid Program that allows students to patrol with the SUNY Police. Prior to working for Livingston County, Jason was a Rochester Police Department Patrolman, Avon Police Department School Resource Officer, and US Investigative Services Special Investigator for the US Office of Personnel Management.

For his service in the US Coast Guard he received the Honor Graduate Medal, National Defense Service Medal, Humanitarian Service Medal, and Armed Forces Expeditionary Medal. Jason Varno was Honorably Discharged in April 1999 at the rank of Petty Officer 3rd Class.

Jason continues to serve our community in the Livingston County Probation Department since September 2004.

Jason has two children. One of his sons currently serves as a Military Policeman in the US Army and was awarded the Distinguished Platoon Graduate Medal in July 2016.

1. Roland Beck, General Park Manager of Letchworth State Park-New York Genesee Park Region

- LETCHWORTH STATE PARK PRESENTATION

Mr. Roland Beck's Comments: Chairman Gott, Board of Supervisors, Administrator Coyle, I am sincerely grateful for the opportunity to address this board and provide you with relevant information that substantiates the value of Letchworth State Park as a major tourism attraction and economic driver in Livingston County. The video playing on the screen in front of you is a four-season tour of the gorge and waterfalls within Letchworth State Park. This video was produced for the opening of our new, state of the art Humphrey Nature Center, an attraction within the park that, since its opening in July of 2016 has become a hub for lectures, programs and guided hikes that help us all understand and learn the significance of the Genesee River Valley and its ecological importance to Letchworth State Park and the environment. This facility has also become an extension of a SUNY Geneseo experience. Through a cooperative agreement with the university, both student and professor acquire knowledge through hands on experience that benefits their programming and the parks continual effort to preserve and protect its natural resources.

Thru William Pryor Letchworth's vision of preserving the natural resources of the Genesee Valley and providing a peaceful and serene area for all to enjoy, he began, knowingly or not, he created an economic driver that would benefit this area as no other. Now, well over 100 years later, Letchworth State Park spans over 14,000 acres in two counties, offers diverse outdoor activities, various camping and cabin options, hot air ballooning, fine dining, and if the 782 thousand, 6 hundred and 3 visitors — well over three quarters of a million people - in 2016 doesn't clearly point to Letchworth State Park as the largest tourism draw to our area, we believe that their economic impact to the surrounding communities will attest.

Based on credible tourism models that estimate visitor expenditures, leisure visitors to an area spend, on average approximately \$90 dollars per one day visit and, approximately \$200 dollars per overnight stay. On average, Letchworth State Park's overnight visitors stay for 5 nights.

Because we know that visitors to Letchworth make their way into the surrounding communities for dining, lodging, to purchase gas, other essentials and souvenirs or to visit other attractions, it's clear that their spending benefits our local, and regional, economy.

Letchworth State Park is also very proud to be the home of the annual Letchworth Arts and Craft Show every October. The show is held at our Highbanks Recreation Area and because of its location, clearly sits in Livingston County. This event sees close to 100 thousand visitors each year and features 300 plus vendors. Recently in "Sunshine Artist," America's Premier Art and Craft Show Magazine, the Letchworth Craft Show was rated one of the best shows for vendors in the United States and, vendors reported average sales at 3 thousand 5 hundred eighty dollars each.

From the perspective of tax revenue to this great county we again are very proud of this show and how its impact is positive for Livingston County.

In closing and on behalf of New York State Parks, Recreation and Historic Preservation, Genesee State Park Region and Letchworth State Park I'd like to extend our sincerest thanks for your continual support of Letchworth State Park particularly as you continue to support the Livingston County Chamber of Commerce and Tourism Promotion Agency. As your official Tourism Promotion Agency, they have historically and continually built awareness for Letchworth through various programs and collaborations and have championed our virtues and the value of the communities that surround the park. They embody professional marketing skill and it is our continual hope that their efforts on our behalf and that of the communities that surround Letchworth State Park will continue to grow.

From the number one state park in the nation, again I offer thanks on behalf of everyone at Letchworth State Park, your Grand Canyon of the East.

2. AMIE ALDEN, COUNTY HISTORIAN

- DEPARTMENTAL UPDATES

Amie Alden comments: Thank you for allowing me the privilege of the floor today and it's been my privilege to serve as your County Historian for close to 14 years.

First, I would like to recognize my deputy historian Holly Watson in the audience today. Her energy, organizational and technical skills have brought the historian's office to a higher level and I am so grateful to have her assistance.

I would also like to introduce several of the town historians in the audience today: Avon-Maureen Kingston, Caledonia-Eileen LaFave-Bickford, Conesus-Brenda Eddy, Leicester-Karen Roffe, Livonia-Betty Miles, Nunda-Valerie Griffing, Ossian-Rhea Walker, Portage-Lorraine Rocker, Sparta-Mary Jo Marks and her husband Leo Marks (former Sparta Supervisor), West Sparta-David Palmer, and York-Steve Gates (also a Vietnam Veteran.)

These people often work behind the scenes but their influence is visible in nearly every corner of our county: from historic markers, to publications, dedications, programs and events.

I like to remind people that in 1919 New York State enacted a law creating the first (and the only state in the country) to have a network of officially appointed local government historians.

Dr. James Sullivan serving as State Historian originally lobbied for the position to help document the service of WW I soldiers returning home. He also felt local contacts could be very useful in the development of history programs across New York, leading grass roots preservation, historical research, and commemorative celebrations.

The County Historians position was created in 1933 to oversee the activities of the town historians as well as document history at the county and regional level. Livingston County has continually supported that position.

As a whole Town Historians seldom receive recognition for the vital role they play in preserving and interpreting our cultural heritage. So I am pleased today to acknowledge this group of dedicated public servants and thank them for their contribution to the quality of life we enjoy here in Livingston County.

The Powerpoint Office updates – An exhibit in honor of the centennial of America's entry into World War I is on display in the 2nd floor foyer and will remain up until after Veteran's Day. More than 50 men from Livingston County were died while serving in the war.

In honor of the centennial of the passage of the woman suffrage in New York State and in anticipation of the centennial of national woman suffrage in 2020, I have been continuing to gather information on women from Livingston County involved in the local and national suffrage movement.

A new audio driving tour entitled "Livingston Landmarks Heritage Trail" is being added to the Oncell Audio Tours. The landmarks tour is divided in to three sections across the county. On the Main Drag included several sites easily spotted on state roads; Around the Bend includes places just a short distance off the main roads; and Off the Beaten Path includes some more remote, but easily accessible, sites around the county.

An ideal spot: Murray Hill, Mount Morris, NY – has been an on-going research book project that hopefully will be finished soon. The book will cover the time period from the early 1800s to present day and document the many interesting people who occupied this site and their larger influence on the local, national, and international stage. The office has many photographs that we would like to display when the Auditorium project on Murray Hill is completed.

2021 marks Livingston County's Bicentennial and it's not too early to start planning for this special event. This is a once in a lifetime opportunity to commemorate and celebrate our past and present while leaving a legacy for our future. An organizational meeting is scheduled for October and within the next few months I would like to see a public meeting to gather ideas from a wide variety of groups including county departments, civic organizations, schools, libraries, and veterans to ensure the broadest participation.
