PRIVILEGES OF THE FLOOR

TOM WAMP, BOARD MEMBER & MICHAEL KANE, PRESIDENT & CEO OF THE WESTERN REGIONAL OFF TRACK BETTING ORGANIZATION

- 2015 PROGRAM UPDATE

Mr. Wamp thanked the Board for this opportunity to present their annual program overview. Next week is the opening of the Batavia Downs race track. The racing season will see about 72 race dates and will go to the second week of December. He wanted to be sure to invite everyone to have a great time up there. He is from Livingston County and the President and CEO is from Livingston County and we make sure we take care of Livingston County. He presented a quick overview of the information distributed to the board members. This is a public benefit corporation. It consists of 15 counties from Erie and Niagara on the west side, Cayuga and Wayne on the east side and 2 cities, the Rochester and Buffalo. This means that the proceeds from the various business centers that we have goes to the member counties. There is a formula that they use and, from the surcharge monies from the Off Track Betting Corporation part of the business, the parlors, Easy Bets' and the gaming; Livingston County has received \$60,000 in the past year. The economic benefits are numerous. There are 400-500 employees that have good paying jobs. In Livingston County we still have a betting parlor in Geneseo. The Corporation feels that the future of the betting is in Easy Bets. Livingston County has two Easy Bets, one at Fanatics in Lima, which is doing well and one that just opened this past year at the Wadsworth Grill in York, which is also doing very well. We encourage any supervisors that have a good location, our staff would take a look at those just to see, as a lot of the thoroughbred tracks are during the 12:00-1:00 p.m. If the particular restaurant has a lunch menu, that is certainly a benefit all the way around. As many of you know, Thurman Thomas has been a great asset as the spokesman for the entire gaming facility. If you haven't been to Rush 34, you should really go there. It is second to none in terms of its quality. Mike Kane came on board in 1998. He has worn a lot of hats in those 17 years. Previous to becoming President, he was Vice President of Administration and oversaw much of the operations and especially the racing. He has done a great job since becoming President and CEO in 2011. He is sorry to say the Mr. Kane will be retiring at an undetermined date.

Mr. Kane reviewed the changes to the facility in the last 18 months. They are very proud of wheat has been developed. They now have banquet facilities for 1,000 people in three different venues. Mr. Kane clarified that they are open every day from 8:00 a.m.-4:00 a.m. The racing season opens next week. The one thing they lack in promoting their facility is accommodations. They have worked out an arrangement and will be closing on a piece of property for an 82 room hotel that will essentially be connected to the facility. In fact the registration for the hotel will be inside the gaming facility. Construction is scheduled to begin in two weeks. They are very happy to begin what seems to be the next logical step in order to compete in a rather dense gaming marketplace. This will give us that little extra advantage that we lost when the Seneca/New York State memorandum took place two years ago. That memorandum restricted their capabilities immensely. They had to take any machine off the floor that "looked" like a slot machine and they were their 64 best machines. They also will not have any table games, either electronic or real until, potentially, 2023, which is the date the Seneca agreement expires and has to be renewed. That limits the capabilities to, not only them but the Finger Lakes in Hamburg. Both as a way to offset those losses, but mainly encourage people to support the referendum, the Governor's legislation, the Upstate Gaming and Economic Development Act, the distribution of revenues from the Seneca's changed to just going to the City of Niagara Falls and New York State to now be distributed to the counties and school districts within the exclusivity region. This is actually more revenue than we can generate in a year to Livingston County even if we had those competitive advantages. Two years ago the Department of Budget estimated, prior to its adoption, that Livingston County would generate in excess of \$406,000 annually from the state based on the Seneca MOU. The school districts within the county would receive in excess of \$1,000,000. Mr.
