RESOLVED, that the Livingston County Board of Supervisors, pursuant to Section 359 of the County Law, will hold public hearings on the proposed Livingston County Budget for the fiscal year 2016 at 1:35 p.m. in the afternoon and also at 7:00 p.m. in the evening on Wednesday, November 18, 2015 in the Board of Supervisors Assembly Room in the Livingston County Government Center in the Village of Geneseo, New

York, and, be it further

RESOLVED, that the Clerk of the Board will cause a Notice of Public Hearing to be published in the official newspapers of the County in a manner required by Section 359 of the County Law.

He will be filing the tentative budget with the Clerk this week.

Pre-approved Informational Item(s) To Be Reported

1. Review of 2016 - 2020 Capital Improvement Plan-Mr. Coyle will not ask for approval of the plan until the next Ways and Means meeting. The Capital Improvement Plan is a 5 year CIP. It is a combination of existing reserves, grants and annual contributions made as part of the budget process. Enterprise Resource System (ERP) for the county financial systems is the biggest project we have planned over a two year period. We are looking at 2018 for the voting machines. Building 1 has a lot of existing funds still available. We are looking at tech updates in the meeting rooms and board room for the Government Center. The CIP reads like we need \$12M but we have \$9.894M in grant funds. We are looking at repurposing building 8. The public hearing for the Millennium Drive project is this week. The Village will be helping us out with the sidewalk and roadway project. The CIP came out of one of our bonding rating reviews. It has worked out really good for us. Angela is heavily involved in this effort and has done great work on this.

2016 County Budget Process-1% on the rate impact and a touch under 2% on the levy impact. What this means is the average single family home is around \$125,000, the levy/cost impact to that person is a little under \$10.00. Because we all did the Government Efficiency Plan and that was approved, residents will be receiving a small check back from the state. Some budget impacts are the higher than average revenues coming in from the jail, resulting in higher expenses. Sales tax looks to be on pace. The fourth quarter is uncertain because of the low gas prices. The question is then if the tax payer saves that money or do they spend it. And, do they spend it in Livingston County. Medicaid, for the first time, will decrease slightly in the 2016 budget, but it is still approximately \$9.3-\$9.5M expense which is \$.40 of every dollar collect goes to pay a single bill.
