GCC Walkway

Supervisor Falk is in negotiations with the home closest to Shawndra to get an easement. The homeowner agreed to sign the easement if the Town would replace the culvert to the driveway as the culvert is delaminating inside. The fees to replace the culvert are approximately \$300. A motion by Councilperson Mayer to expend the funds for the pipe and make as part of the project, seconded by Councilperson Gardner, the vote went as follows: CARRIED Ayes: 4 Falk, Mayer, Gardner, Marcellus Nays: 0

Highway Superintendent Arner stated if the state will not replace the culvert that his crew will.

Falk will revisit the 2 homes still needing easements. After the culvert is replaced sidewalk from Slocum Road to the Dollar General can be completed.

Further updates will follow.

Cogliatore Subdivision

Falk mentioned Attorney Campbell emailed a cost estimate to form a water district to encompass the development and the following fees were submitted: engineering fees \$750 and legal fees estimated at \$2,000. Nick Cogliatore phoned Supervisor Falk stating MJ Pipe is going to charge him around \$7,000 for the meter and Pit and asked for relief from the Town since the Town will benefit from the water. The board discussed same indicating they do not believe this is legal to do. Town Attorney Campbell will be notified of said request. The board was not in favor of paying for the meter or pit.

Councilperson Gardner requested the water not be turned on until an agreement is signed and payment is received in full. Arner indicated the water will need to be turned on for a bit to be tested but could then be turned back off.

Post Office

Supervisor Falk informed the board the roofing contractor originally hired to repair the roof bailed out and are currently looking for another roofer. Updates to follow.

Employee Handbook

Councilperson Gardner suggested the board have a series of meetings to go through parts of the Lima handbook and bolster ours with the sample from Pittsford's handbook to compare and contrast. They agreed a more thorough and detailed handbook is needed. After discussion it was agreed to have 2 board members from the Town, Councilperson Gardner and Marcellus and 2 board members from the Village work together and get a draft completed by January's Organizational meeting. Falk will include Library policy for comparison.

Electronic Communications

Councilperson Marcellus asked if any quotes were received. There were none. No further discussion.

Dog Control

The board agreed to table this discussion to the joint Town & Village meeting July 17th at 6:30PM.

Water Rate Increase

Falk mentioned district #2 water rates were increased by the Village to the Town in July. The increase was .07 cents, \$1.61 to \$1.68, of which increase was not increased on the Towns end. Supervisor Falk suggested raising Town rates .09 or .10 cents. He mentioned the Town is also looking to upgrade and install electrical meters to avoid misreads, which is the bulk of complaints. This upgrade would cost approximately \$20,000. Falk will send out an email to board members with information on rates, possibly lowering the units/gallons, how to communicate these changes to users, etc., and have further discussion at the next meeting.

Ethics Board Reappointment

Upon motion by Councilperson Mayer to reappoint Hildagarde Turk as Chairperson to the Ethics Board, seconded by Councilperson Gardner, the vote went as follows:
