### **MOTION**

#### **MOTION**

Motion made by John Correll, seconded by Joe Schwing to approve abstracts A-12 for \$17,290.64, Ambulance for \$\$1,498.00, F-12 for \$14,062.96, and G-12 for \$9,979.01. Motion unanimously approved.

Mayor Luft introduced the new fire chief, Jim Pribanich. He reviewed some procedures for dealing with Reserve Funds and end of year bills.

Fire Department Report was given to the Board. Jim presented three (3) quotes for the purchase of four (4) sets of gear:

Churchville Fire Equipment - \$2,261.00 per set. Jerome Fire Equipment - \$3,287.00 per set. Garrison Fire & Rescue - 42,295.00 per set.

Motion made by Jerry Warsaw, seconded by Joe Schwing to approve the low bid of \$2,261.00 per set for a total of \$9,044.00 from Churchville Fire Equipment. Motion unanimously carried.

## **MOTION**

Motion made by Jean Lacey, seconded by Jerry Warsaw to approve Robert Steen as a member of the Fire Department pending the passing of his background check. Motion unanimously approved.

DICK GAREY: Dick stated that the concrete barrier around the large tree in front of Upper Deck is buckling and presents a hazard. Discussion was held on this matter. Ben will look at the situation and determine a fix.

Dick mentioned that he would like to have a small bus stop, provided by the Rochester Transit Authority, to be set up on his property behind the fence to encourage Park 'N Ride and provide shelter for bus riders. He proposed a one (1) year period to see if it would be used and would work. Discussion was held on the matter. Concern was voiced over the location and look of the bus stop. Deputy Mayor Lacey will look at pictures of the bus stop with Dick and give the Board her opinion.

Building Inspector Report, Ambulance Report, WWTP Report, Financial Reports and Jobs Completed by village crew were given to the Board.
