LEAF PICK-UP: Please put your leaves (only leaves, no brush) by the edge of the road, not in the road or covering drainage ditches or catch basins. We will pick up leaves until the first snowfall or December 1st. After December 1st leaves must be in **biodegradable** bags only.

CEO: Remember to have your chimney cleaned and checked before using your fireplace or pellet stove. Remember to check the batteries in your smoke detectors. Building permit applications and Planning and Zoning Board applications are now available on our website.

HUNTING: Hunting of any kind is prohibited in the Village of Lima (Local Law # 5 of 2007).

LIGHTING LAW: Local Law # 3 of 2012 was established to promote public safety and welfare by regulating outdoor lighting to reduce the problems created by improperly designed and installed outdoor lighting. This section is intended to eliminate problems of glare and minimize light trespass to keep unnecessary direct light from shining onto abutting properties or streets, to help reduce costs of outdoor lighting, and to reduce sky glow.
